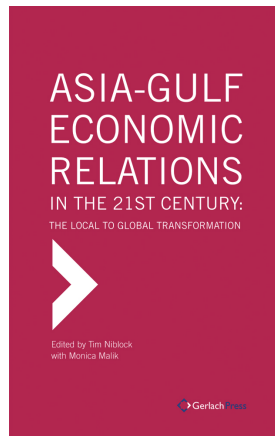

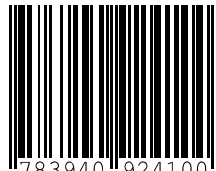
ASIA-GULF ECONOMIC RELATIONS IN THE 21ST CENTURY. THE LOCAL TO GLOBAL TRANSFORMATION
